Construction Case Brings U.S. Marine \$5 million award - Highway Safety Case

Ten Ways to Win Your Highway Safety Case

In analyzing motor vehicle accidents, trial counsel may overlook the highway defects and ambient highway design and safety considerations. The following ten tips have proven effective for Leesfield Leighton & Partners:

- Never assume "it is only driver error" on behalf of the plaintiff/defendant or other operators. Always do a site visit.
- In any catastrophic injury, immediately investigate the "non-obvious" contributing factors to the incident, including road work and road equipment.
- Be sure defendants receive spoliation letters to preserve and maintain the equipment and all documents related to the collision.
- Always demand the state and federal DOT plans and safety protocols for the accident location.
- Local, state and federal agencies, NHTSA and DOT manuals hold valuable information related to the construction site, plans and safety protocols.
- Do not overlook the environment of the vehicle for potential crashworthiness issues, rollover, roof crush, seatbelt unlatching, defective seat backs, protrusions and vehicle defects which enhance your client's injuries.
- Depositions should only be conducted after every piece of documentary evidence is gathered from defendants, including all prior claims in all locations.
- Depositions should include equipment operators, their supervisors and every employee associated with the project, as well as safety planners, and safety engineers employed by defendants.
- A wealth of depositions and the trial of prior litigation is available through networking with other counsel who have handled other cases against the same or similar defendants.

Recent Verdicts and Settlements

The following are recent representative verdicts and settlements. Some cases with confidential agreements or otherwise may not be reported.

\$2.1 million verdict in Key West.

Kemp v. AMR, et al. Case No.

CA-K-03-401

In Key West, Stuart Kemp received significant fractures to his face and major compression fractures to his vertebrae when his moped was struck by defendant's ambulance. There was no offer at trial from American Medical Response, the nation's largest ambulance company, and the jury was out three hours. Partners **Thomas Scolaro** and **Patricia Kennedy** joined **Ira Leesfield** in representing plaintiff.

\$8 million award in Broward County

Wrongful Death Pursuant to mandatory arbitration rules, John Leighton obtained an \$8,000,000 arbitration award for the family of K.S., who was killed in a catastrophic trucking accident on the Florida Turnpike.

\$1.5 million wrongful death award

Hospital negligence at birth

(Confidential Settlement)

Leesfield Leighton & Partners performed a medical investigation into the cause of "Betty Doe's" untimely death. Partner John Leighton discovered that nursing errors compounded the original failure to provide reasonable care at delivery and post-delivery. The case was settled with the hospital and doctor for \$1,500,000 which will provide for the economic future for Betty's son.

\$500,000 award in Collier County.

Hunter v. Lozano Case No. 05-1062-CA

When 23-year-old Felicia Hunter was critically injured in Naples, Florida, Virginia co-counsel, Lisa O'Donnell, did not hesitate to call Leesfield Leighton & Partners. **Ira Leesfield** left immediately for Naples, Florida while **John Leighton** was in trial in Central Florida.
